"My degree is in maths".... ~~the~~

This boastful air created ~~the~~ effect of this is Hilary's blunt "wow"
Hilary ~~bluntly~~ ~~replies~~ ~~"wow"~~ This interaction suggests that Amal feels himself to be above Hilary as he lists his many ~~own~~ achievements. The long list puts emphasis on his pride. Hilary's response to this with a short "statement":

This short statement suggests she is taken aback by this and gives the impression that she is intimidated by him. This tension is created extremely well later during the interactions between Amal, Leo and Hilary in which Amal exclaims that Hilary's ideas are "mysticism." This word choice suggests he believes her ideas to be a fairytale and

unrealistic. Therefore a tension is created as he is essentially undermining her opinions ~~throughout the extract~~

~~Overall~~ Overall, the use of word choice is of importance in developing an air of tension between characters within the extract as it emphasises ~~Anals's superiority~~ Anals's belief that he is superior to those around him.
