This is where the service user gets observed so the worker can find out what kind of care plan they need, and what needs they have. very important This can include observing the service user in their day to day life and also sitting down with the families so they speak about concerns they have.</p>	

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The last stage of the care planning process is Review. This is when the service user has settled in to their care plan and has had time to see if it helps. The worker will have a meeting with the service user to discuss what is working and what is not, and also for the service user to express any concerns they have. The worker will take these into consideration and adjust the care plan to suit the concerns and what is not working.
