

Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component.

Candidate 1

Section 1 – Human Development and Behaviour

Question 1(a)

The candidate was awarded **1 mark** for this question.

One mark for phase:

- ◆ "...accepting the loss...is a big loss."

Question 1(b)

The candidate was awarded **0 marks** for this question.

No marks awarded for second phase as no determinants of grief discussed.

Question 2

The candidate was awarded **3 marks** for this question.

One mark per sentence for core conditions:

- ◆ "...genuines of the worker..."
- ◆ "speak freely without being judged."
- ◆ "...put themselves...service user."

Section 2 – Social Influences

Question 3

The candidate was awarded **0 marks** for this question.

No knowledge of conflict theory shown.

Question 4

The candidate was awarded **1 mark** for this question.

One mark for:

- ◆ "...secondary...norms of the world."

Question 5

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** for this question.

One mark per sentence for first feature:

- ◆ "...stigma around...roles values and norms."
- ◆ "...it could lead to...because of her label."

Section 3 – Values and Principles

Question 6(a)

The candidate was awarded **4 marks** for this question.

One mark per sentence for each of the two stages:

- ◆ "...observed so the worker can find out what kind of care..."
- ◆ "...day to day life...about concerns they have."
- ◆ "...to discuss what is working ."
- ◆ "...and adjust the care plan to suit..."

Question 6(b)

The candidate was awarded **0 marks** for this question.

No aspect of positive care practice linked to the stages of the care plan.

Question 7

The candidate was awarded **0 marks** for this question.

No organisational features discussed.

Question 8

The candidate was awarded **3 marks** for this question.

One holistic mark at the end of the paragraph for compassion.

One mark per sentence for confidentiality:

- ◆ "...not say anything to anyone..."
- ◆ "...to tell someone higher up than them."

Overall, the candidate was awarded **14/40 marks**.
