10)	<p>"crabbit" has connotations of being grumpy. This shows that they have strong feelings about Lizzie as they don't view her as kind.</p> <p>"interested in me" "A she's interested in is ma pension book" shows how selfish Lizzie is as she isn't doing this to help her mother but to get money.</p>
11)	<p>"Shiny" shows how ^(Eddie) a young girl has got little to eat, meaning the family struggle with food. This gives a clear impression of the Morrison's life as it shows they don't have enough money to feed everyone sufficiently.</p> <p>"cast-off clothing" shows how the clothes are old and ragged. This shows a clear impression of the family's life as they can't afford good clothes.</p> <p>"guid leatherin" implies that the child needs a beating. 	<p>Extract:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• "A she's interested in's ma pension book" shows how money is a prominent issue and great motivation for many people, including Lizzie.• "Lizzie's tee take her turn" shows how the family members take it in turns to care for Granny, showing a sense of strong family connections.
	<p>Elsewhere:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Granny shares a bed with Jenny which shows how the family are living on minimal money as there are issues of overcrowding in the home and not enough space, as they can't afford it.• Granny's interactions with the two delivery men who know her well with one of them saying "tell your Granny yae didnae mean it" as he

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	respects her shows the theme of community throughout the play.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As Granny has to live between Maggie and Lizzie's house, it shows how they have little money as they cannot afford a house for Granny or for her to be properly looked after. • As Lizzie will not take Granny home until she gets some of her pension off Maggie, it shows how there are also negative aspects to family as well as Lizzie only cares for Granny because of her pension.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Granny often talks to the neighbours, who often refer to her as 'poor soul' which shows the sense of community as they help out and take care of Granny as well.
