Question 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for <i>detailed/insightful</i> comment on idea of the unsettling nature of Central Valley created by 'deeply disturbing' ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the complete absence of wildlife suggested by the list 'no birds...' (3 marks)
Question 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on 'grotesquely' being something 'vile or disgusting' ◆ 0 marks for comment on list because there is no reference to the number of scientific procedures to which the cows are subjected ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on connotations of 'crammed' being 'no freedom to move' (2 marks)
Question 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for understanding of the key point (the movement from USA to UK) supported by appropriate use of quotation covering both sides 'Could the British...wave of intensification' ◆ NB The candidate has chosen to answer this as a traditional link question which is entirely acceptable (2 marks)
Question 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 0 marks for lift of 'locally' ◆ 1 mark for idea of buying less foreign food ◆ 0 marks for lift of 'cheap(er)' ◆ 1 mark for idea of easing pressure on farmers 'vast unsustainable volume' ◆ 1 mark for idea of buying environmentally friendly food ◆ 1 mark for idea of consumers' desire to buy less expensive food 'low-cost meat' (4 marks)
Question 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 0 marks for comment on image of 'front line' as there is no reference to idea of a desperate struggle against competitors ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the punctuation. Helpful use of intensifier 'even' to show understanding of the extent of people affected by intensive farming (1 mark)
Question 7	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for idea of air pollution 'air...toxic' (1 mark)
Question 8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> (structural) comment on key idea that intensive farming can now be witnessed in the UK 'already'

	underway in Britain' (1 mark)
Question 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ 1 mark for intensive farming yields affordable food for everyone◆ 1 mark for unnatural nature of intensive farming◆ 1 mark for intensive farming damages the environment and wildlife◆ 1 mark for appropriate use of supporting evidence (in the form of quotation) (4 marks)
