Question 1	<p>This candidate scores full marks in the opening sentence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for idea of diverse 'wide variety of fruit' ◆ 1 mark for idea of attractive 'pleasant scent' <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for <i>detailed/insightful</i> comment on connotations/alliteration of 'deeply disturbing' which the candidate links to unnatural 'macabre/magnitude of unnatural feeling' ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on repetition of 'no' to suggest how much of nature is missing ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on 'single' which continues idea of empty 'devoid' <p>(4 marks)</p>
Question 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on 'crammed' suggesting stifling conditions – 'squished in together' ◆ 1 mark for idea of the list highlighting the repetitive/limiting nature of the cows' lives, 'none of which...dull and lifeless' (Although this answer <i>looks</i> detailed, the first part of it relies too closely on the wording of the passage 'fed/milked/injected' to gain 2 marks) ◆ 0 marks for comment on 'grotesquely' as it is merely assertion <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for insightful comment on key point 'suggesting that they too are doomed' supported by appropriate quotation and reference ◆ This answer demonstrates a different (but equally valid) approach from that taken by Candidate 1. <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 0 marks for lift of 'local produce' ◆ 1 mark for idea of easing pressure on farmers 'super farms' ◆ 1 mark for idea of buying environmentally friendly food ◆ 1 mark for idea of consumers' desire to buy less expensive food ◆ 1 mark for idea of unconcerned about the origins of food 'don't care where it comes from' <p>(4 marks)</p>

Question 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for <i>detailed/insightful</i> comment on ‘dirty secret’ involving ‘dodgy dealings’ and the ‘truth being kept’ from the public ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the image of ‘factory farms’. Even though not this is in Marking Instructions, a valid point is made ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the list emphasising the range of stories by people affected <p>(4 marks)</p>
Question 7	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for idea of waste ◆ 1 mark for idea of overpowering smell ◆ 1 mark for idea of blight on the landscape <p>(3 marks)</p>
Question 8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 2 marks for holistic, insightful comments dealing with the last paragraph’s effectiveness in terms of its structure and emotional impact ‘doomed to have intensive farms’, ‘sneaky... into society unnoticed’ <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for intensive farming may have a negative impact on human health ◆ 0 marks for factory farming’s growth in the UK as this is not a key area of agreement ◆ 1 mark for undue stress and suffering caused to animals ◆ 2 marks for <i>detailed/insightful</i> use of supporting evidence <p>(4 marks)</p>
