Question	Comment/Mark
Question 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for idea of idyllic 'air and atmosphere was fresh' ◆ 1 mark for idea of vast scale 'miles of landscape' <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the list/repetition of 'no', emphasising the <i>extent</i> of the lack of wildlife ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on 'deeply disturbing' linked to unsettling <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on 'crammed' as being 'squashed and confined' ◆ 1 mark for <i>more basic</i> comment on the list suggesting cows are merely part of a repetitive, industrial process ◆ 0 marks for comment on 'grotesquely' as 'beyond their limit' does not link closely enough to idea of monstrous/hideous <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark is awarded for a <i>more basic</i> comment on the key point supported by appropriate quotation: 'Could the British countryside...' <p>(1 mark)</p>
Question 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for idea of buy less foreign food ◆ 1 mark for idea of buy more British produce ◆ 0 marks for lift of 'cheap' ◆ 1 mark for idea of specialities are now inexpensive ◆ Comment about unhealthy nature of food is not relevant so does not gain any marks <p>(3 marks)</p>
Question 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 0 marks for comment on image of 'front line' as there is no recognition of the writer's idea of a desperate struggle ◆ 0 marks for comment on image of 'dirty secret' as there is no reference to the hidden/shocking nature <p>(0 marks)</p>
Question 7	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for visible contamination of air: 'dirty air' ◆ 1 mark for idea of poor condition of animal shelters ◆ No further marks as the third point is simply a repetition of the second <p>(2 marks)</p>
Question 8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ 1 mark for recognition of idea that factory farms are getting larger in a rather surreptitious way 'without being noticed' <p>(1 mark)</p>

Question 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ 1 mark for intensive farming may have a negative impact on human health◆ 1 mark for intensive farming damages the environment and wildlife◆ 1 mark for undue stress and suffering caused to animals◆ 2 marks for <i>detailed/insightful</i> use of supporting evidence (in the form of quotation and comment) (5 marks)
