

# Commentary on candidate 1 evidence

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component:

## Question 1(b)

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 2 marks available** because:

### Bullet point 1

The candidate's response states the benefit of a crease resistant finish will mean the clothes will not become crushed which is incorrect, therefore no mark is awarded.

### Bullet point 2

The candidate has provided a correct discussion point correctly linking to the benefits of a crease resistant finish; therefore, 1 mark is awarded.

## Question 1(c)

The candidate was awarded **3 marks out of the 3 marks available** because:

### Evaluation 1

The candidate has correctly identified a feature of social media is that it would reach a large audience and will be more popular so increasing sales, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Evaluation 2

The candidate has correctly identified a feature of social media is that friends could share adverts so increasing sales; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Evaluation 3

The candidate has correctly identified a feature of social media is that the collection could receive bad publicity so decreasing sales, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

## Question 2

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 10 marks available** because:

### Bullet point 1

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (crease resistant) will affect the item and has linked this to the requirement of the staff uniform, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Bullet point 2

The candidate has correctly identified the property (breathable) however they have not linked this correctly to their examination to the staff uniform, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The characteristic identified (soft handle) by the candidate is not accurate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 4**

The property identified (strength) by the candidate is not accurate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 5**

The property identified (absorbent) by the candidate is not accurate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 6**

There is no explanation of the construction of the set-in sleeves offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 7**

There is no explanation of the construction of the patch pocket and the reason for its use for the staff uniform has not been offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 8**

There is no explanation of the construction technique of the exposed zip offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 9**

The explanation of the construction of the hem offered by the candidate is correct however the images does not illustrate the inside of the uniform top and the construction technique needs to be visible, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 10**

There is no explanation of the construction technique for topstitching offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Question 3(a)**

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 3 marks available** because:

**Bullet point 1**

The candidate has correctly provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered for the prom outfit (the fit) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 2**

The candidate has correctly provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered for the prom outfit (unique) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The candidate has provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered (unique/look) however this is a repeat of bullet point 2 therefore no mark is awarded.

### Question 3(b)

The candidate was awarded **3 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

#### Evaluation 1

The candidate has correctly identified drape as a feature of silk, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of a prom outfit (look smart) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 2

The candidate has correctly identified soft as a feature of silk, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of a prom outfit (comfort) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 3

The candidate has incorrectly identified cool as a feature of silk; therefore, no mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 4

The candidate has correctly identified delicate as a feature of silk, has made a judgement and has made a link to the requirements of a prom outfit (not rip) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Question 3(c)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 3 marks available** because:

#### Bullet point 1

The candidate has explained the importance of fabric requirement on a commercial pattern; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Bullet point 2

The candidate has explained the importance of a back view on a commercial pattern; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Bullet point 3

The candidate has not explained the importance of a requirements/notions on a commercial pattern; therefore, no mark is awarded.

**For Question 3, the candidate was awarded a total of 7 marks out of a total 10 marks available.**

### Question 4(a)

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 6 marks available** because:

#### Cost

The candidate has incorrectly identified a design principle (cost), therefore no mark is awarded.

#### Aesthetics

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (aesthetics-looking good/cool), therefore 1 mark is awarded. The candidate has not given an explanation linked to the requirements of a children's track top, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Quality**

The candidate has correctly identified a relevant design principle (quality), however the explanation does not link to the principle of design therefore no mark is awarded.

**Question 4(b)**

The candidate was awarded **4 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

**Bullet point 1**

The candidate has correctly identified embroidery as a suitable method of embellishment; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 2**

The candidate has provided a correct reason for using embroidery as a logo on the children's track top, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The candidate has provided a correct reason for using embroidery as it's flat on the children's track top, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 4**

The candidate has provided a correct reason for using embroidery as it will withstand wear and tear, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**For Question 4, the candidate was awarded a total of 5 marks out of a total 10 marks available.**

# Commentary on candidate 2 evidence

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component:

## Question 1(b)

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 2 marks available** because:

### Bullet point 1

The candidate's response states the benefit of a crease-resistant finish will mean the clothes will not be as creased when removed from the case which is correct, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Bullet point 2

The candidate has provided an incorrect benefit, stating that the clothes do not need ironed due to the crease resistant finish; therefore, no mark is awarded.

## Question 1(c)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 3 marks available** because:

### Evaluation 1

The candidate has correctly identified a feature of social media is that it is free and will be more popular so not cost to the manufacturer, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Evaluation 2

The candidate has correctly identified a feature of social media is that it would reach a large audience and will be shared with a variety of people, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

### Evaluation 3

The candidate has incorrectly identified a feature of social media is that it is easy to use so the manufacturer can focus on other task however this is not factually correct; therefore, no mark is awarded.

## Question 2

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 10 marks available** because:

### Bullet point 1

The explanation of the property offered by the candidate is incorrect, therefore no mark is awarded.

### Bullet point 2

The explanation of the property offered by the candidate is incorrect, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (absorbency) is used in the item and has linked this to the requirements for staff uniform therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 4**

The characteristic identified (drape) by the candidate is not accurate, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 5**

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (crease resistant) will affect the item and has linked this to the requirement of staff uniform, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 6**

The explanation of the construction of the princess seam offered by the candidate is not accurate and does not link to the requirements for the staff uniform, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 7**

The candidate has not provided the type of sleeve used on the uniform and has not provided a reason for the function of the sleeve; therefore, no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 8**

The candidate has not provided enough detail on the construction of a patch pocket and the link to the uniform, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 9**

The candidate has not detailed the type of zip used and there is no link to the uniform/staff, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Question 3(a)**

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 3 marks available** because:

**Bullet point 1**

The candidate has correctly provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered for the prom outfit (the fit) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 2**

The candidate has provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered for the prom outfit (unique and fit) however there is no explanation and fit is a repeat of bullet point 1 therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The candidate has provided a benefit of bespoke tailoring to be considered (durable) however this is not an accurate benefit therefore no mark is awarded.

### Question 3(b)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

#### Evaluation 1

The candidate has correctly identified drape as a feature of silk, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of a prom outfit (look smart) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 2

The candidate has correctly identified creases easily as a feature of silk, has made a judgement but the link to the requirement of a prom outfit is not linked to the event therefore no mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 3

The candidate has correctly identified soft as a feature of silk, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of a prom outfit (comfort) therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Evaluation 4

The candidate has incorrectly identified cool as a feature of silk; therefore, no mark is awarded.

### Question 3(c)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 3 marks available** because:

#### Bullet point 1

The candidate has not correctly explained the importance of fabric requirement on a commercial pattern; therefore, no mark is awarded.

#### Bullet point 2

The candidate has explained the importance of a back view on a commercial pattern; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

#### Bullet point 3

The candidate has explained the importance of a requirements/notions on a commercial pattern; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**For Question 3, the candidate was awarded a total of 5 marks out of a total 10 marks available.**

### Question 4(a)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 6 marks available** because:

#### Safety

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (safety – not contain any loose parts), therefore 1 mark is awarded. The candidate has given a correct explanation linked to the requirements of a children's track top, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Quality**

The candidate has correctly identified a relevant design principle (quality – long lasting), however they have not described it therefore no mark is awarded. The candidate has given an explanation however it does not link to the design feature; therefore, no mark is awarded.

**Durability**

The candidate has correctly identified a relevant design principle (durability), however it has not been fully described therefore no mark is awarded. The candidate has not provided an explanation of the design principle for the children's track top, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Ease of care**

The candidate has incorrectly identified a design principle (ease of care), therefore no mark is awarded.

**Question 4(b)**

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

**Bullet point 1**

The candidate has correctly identified embroidery as a suitable method of embellishment; therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 2**

The candidate has provided an incorrect reason and not an accurate reason for using embroidery on the children's track top, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 3**

The candidate has provided a reason for using embroidery (represent team) however they have not stated how this would be done on the children's track top, therefore no mark is awarded.

**Bullet point 4**

The candidate has provided a correct reason for using embroidery as it will withstand wear and tear/washing, therefore 1 mark is awarded.

**For Question 4, the candidate was awarded a total of 4 marks out of a total 10 marks available.**
