

Commentary on Workshop 1 candidate evidence

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component.

Question 1a

The candidate was awarded **5 marks out of the 10 marks available** because:

Bullet point 1

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the bright blue, red and yellow) therefore one mark is awarded.

Although the candidate has identified a key feature, the discussion point does not show a link to an item suitable for the collections, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 2

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the sprinkles on the cone), therefore one mark is awarded.

The design feature can be clearly identified and is applied to an item suitable for a summer collection, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 3

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the combination of blue tones) therefore one mark is awarded.

Although the candidate has identified a key feature, the discussion point does not show a link to an item suitable for the collection, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 4

The key feature identified by the candidate is incorrect, therefore no mark is awarded.

As the discussion point is linked to an incorrect feature, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 5

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the swirly shape of the cone). As the candidate has already been credited with the maximum marks available for selection of key features, no further a mark can be awarded.

The design feature can be clearly identified and is applied to an item suitable for a summer collection, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 6

The candidate has not identified a key feature from the images, therefore no mark is awarded.

The discussion point does not show a link to an item suitable for the collection, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 7

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the waves in the background). As the candidate has already been credited with the maximum marks available for selection of key features, no further a mark can be awarded. Although the candidate has identified a key feature, the discussion point links to a potential fabric, but does not show a link to an item suitable for the collection, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 8

The candidate has not identified a key feature from the images, therefore no mark is awarded.
The discussion point is linked to feature that has not been identified, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 9

The key feature identified by the candidate is too vague, therefore no mark is awarded.
As the discussion point is linked to an incorrect feature, no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 10

The candidate has correctly identified a key feature (the swirly shape of the cone). However, the candidate has already identified this as a key feature, so no further mark can be awarded.
The discussion point does not show a link to an item suitable for the collection, therefore no mark is awarded.

Question 1b

The candidate was awarded **3 marks out of the 3 marks available** because.....

Evaluation 1: The candidate has correctly identified free advertising as a feature of social media, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of promoting the collection (increase profits) therefore one mark is awarded.

Evaluation 2: The candidate has correctly identified reaching a wide variety of people as a feature of social media, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of promoting the collection (more people will purchase) therefore one mark is awarded.

Evaluation 3: The candidate has correctly identified receiving negative comments as a feature of social media, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the impact on promoting the collection (won't buy after reading the comments) therefore one mark is awarded.

Question 1c

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 2 marks available** because:

Bullet point 1

The candidate has correctly described a factor to be considered (the cost of fabric) therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 2

The response does not link to mass production, therefore no mark is awarded.

For Question 1, the candidate was awarded a total of 9 marks out of a total 15 marks available.

Question 2

The candidate was awarded **4 marks out of the 10 marks available** because:

Bullet point 1

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (absorbency) is used in the item, but has not linked this to the requirements for staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 2

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (flammability) will affect the item, and has linked this to the requirement of staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 3

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (crease resistant) will affect the item, and has linked this to the requirement of staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 4

The candidate has correctly explained how the property (absorbency) will affect the item, but has not linked this to the requirements for staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 5

The explanation of the property offered by the candidate is incorrect, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 6

There is no explanation of the construction of the patch pocket offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 7

There is no explanation of the construction of the single strap offered by the candidate, therefore no mark is awarded.

Bullet point 8

The candidate has correctly explained how the double row of buttons will affect the item, and has linked this to the requirement of staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 9

The candidate has correctly explained how the piping cord will affect the item, and has linked this to the requirement of staff in the fast food restaurant, therefore one mark is awarded.

Bullet point 10

No response

For Question 2, the candidate was awarded a total of 4 marks out of a total 10 marks available.

Question 3a

The candidate was awarded **3 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

A The candidate has identified the pattern marking (grainline), but has not explained the correct relevance to the shirt, therefore no mark is awarded.

B The candidate has identified the pattern marking (notches), and has explained the relevance to the item, therefore one mark is awarded.

C The candidate has identified the pattern marking (dart), and has and has explained the relevance to the item, therefore one mark is awarded.

D The candidate has identified the pattern marking (position of button), and has and has explained the relevance to the item, therefore one mark is awarded.

Question 3b

The candidate was awarded **1 marks out of the 4 marks available** because:

Evaluation 1: The candidate has incorrectly identified creasing readily as a feature of woven fabrics, therefore no mark is awarded.

Evaluation 2: The candidate has incorrectly identified softness as a feature of woven fabrics, therefore no mark is awarded.

Evaluation 3: The candidate has incorrectly identified lack of ease of staining as a feature of woven fabrics, therefore no mark is awarded.

Evaluation 4: The candidate has correctly identified rigidity as a feature of woven fabrics, has made a judgement, and has made a link to the requirements of promoting the school shirt (look smart) therefore one mark is awarded.

Question 3c

The candidate was awarded **2 marks out of the 2 marks available** because:

Explanation 1 The candidate has offered a correct benefit of shrink resistant finish linked to the school shirt, therefore one mark is awarded.

Explanation 2 The candidate has offered a correct benefit of colourfast finish linked to the school shirt, therefore one mark is awarded.

For Question 3, the candidate was awarded a total of **6 marks out of a total 10 marks available**.

Question 4a

The candidate was awarded **8 marks out of the 8 marks awarded** because:

Function

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (function – allow unrestricted movement), therefore one mark is awarded. The candidate has given a correct explanation linked to the requirements of an outdoor playsuit for a toddler, therefore one mark is awarded.

Aesthetics

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (aesthetics – made of a fabric not irritating to the skin), therefore one mark is awarded. The candidate has given a correct explanation linked to the requirements of an outdoor playsuit for a toddler, therefore one mark is awarded.

Safety

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (safety – not contain any loose parts), therefore one mark is awarded. The candidate has given a correct explanation linked to the requirements of an outdoor playsuit for a toddler, therefore one mark is awarded.

Durability

The candidate has correctly described a relevant design principle (durability – made of strong fabric), therefore one mark is awarded. The candidate has given a correct explanation linked to the requirements of an outdoor playsuit for a toddler, therefore one mark is awarded.

Question 4b

The candidate was awarded **1 mark out of the 2 marks available** because:

Point 1

The candidate has given an incorrect response, therefore no mark is awarded.

Point 2

The candidate has provided a correct benefit of including fabric content information, therefore one mark is awarded.

For Question 4, the candidate was awarded a total of 9 marks out of a total 10 marks available.

The candidate was awarded 27 marks out of a total of 45 marks available for the Question Paper.
