

Commentary on candidate evidence

The following comments explain where and why marks have been allocated for each item/candidate response.

Where there is no comment, the mark allocation is fully explained with reference to the Marking Instructions.

Page 1

KU mark awarded at 'available and popular' for first developed point of background information.

KU mark given at 'tenements for the workers' for the first mention of location of housing.

KU mark awarded for the explanation of tenements close to factories
Underline location 1 – we think this is wrong.

KU mark awarded at 'to the factories' for a developed point on the location of owners houses and a reason for this location linked to transport.

KU mark awarded at 'and air pollution' for a further point on location linked to wind direction.

Page 2

KU mark awarded for 'regeneration of new flats'.

Research methods:

T1 mark given at 'each location' for description of land use survey.

T1 awarded for further development of height adding to land use.

Page 3

T2 mark awarded at 'excellent' for description of Environmental Quality Survey

T2 mark awarded as the candidate has expanded by describing categories (this is not on the PI sheets).

Analysis

PI mark awarded at 'compared to the harbour', with an arrow linking to the 75% residential above for the descriptive points on residential and commercial – two half points.

R at 'residents to walk' as this has been credited on page 1.

Page 4

PI mark awarded for the comparison of the proportion of flats in two areas.

PI mark awarded at 'residential buildings were tenements' for further comparison of pie charts (tenements).

R at 'walk to the factories' as this has been credited earlier.

Caret at 'none'; there are figures here, but no trends/comparative language (this will be rolled together with a later point).

R at the end of this paragraph as this has been credited.

PI mark awarded at the end of the page for comparison of building height (figures are correct 20 compared to 11).

Page 5

PI mark awarded at 'Timmers has none' for the comparison of detached housing.

AN mark awarded at 'save money on land' for noticing an anomaly and the explanation of why flats were chosen.

PI mark given at 'Harbour has none', again there are figures but no trends, however, this is added to the point on the previous page with no trends to award a mark for two undeveloped points.

R at end of page as wind direction has previously been credited.

Page 6

C at 'close to factories' for summary of harbour and a second **C** at 'noise/air pollution' for a second concluding point.
