

### **Candidate A**

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **20 marks** because.....

The candidate has performed very well in the paper gaining full marks. They have taken many notes during the reading of the passage and have then sorted these as the exam went on and reorganised some of their answers particularly those connected with questions 6 and 7 which saw some mixing of answers in some responses.

They have also provided comprehensive answers for questions 8 and 9 and answered in the appropriate style for the types of question.

### **Candidate B**

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **20 marks** because.....

A very strong performance from this candidate. They answer all questions very clearly and again, questions 8 and 9 are answered correctly. In comparison to candidate A, they have been more succinct but have been clear in all of their answers.

### **Candidate C**

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **18 marks** because.....

This candidate has performed very well but has not managed the last question. This is due to the answer not being clear as to what they were meaning. This question and ones like it, needs a clear unambiguous answer.

The candidate's exam technique is evident through use of underlining of key words in the question and their deleted note-taking is also evident.

### Candidate D

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **16 marks** because.....

A good performance from this candidate. The candidate used notes as answers in their responses to some questions which in the main worked, however care should be taken with this as there is a tendency for some answers to be incomplete. The mid-section of the paper was problematic for candidates in their correct selection of material for the particular questions but this candidate has been able to negotiate this part. Question 8 has been answered in a clear succinct fashion however question 9 has not been answered correctly and there is evidence of the note-taking not being converted into a correct answer.

### Candidate E

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **10 marks** because.....

This script illustrates a candidate who has just achieved a pass in this section of the exam. They have been able to gain at least some of the marks for most questions and answered questions 1, 3 and 7b with full marks. Their use of underlining to focus on specific parts of the questions is evident, a practice which can be useful for candidates. They used notes as answers in some of their responses. Their response to question 9 saw them gain some marks however they were unsure in their answer to question 8.

### Candidate F

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for the listening and writing section of the question paper

The candidate was awarded **17 marks** because.....

This candidate has put in a very solid performance and has provided very full responses for many of their answers. Although there is no requirement for this they have gone the extra mile to ensure their marks. Their answers to questions 8 and 9 are particularly comprehensive.
