39). Cicero use rhetorical questioning in line 1 to involve the Jurg so they themselves would think where he was. The repetition of "quo" - ~~add~~ adds suspense to the Jurg - as to where he is. The use of the superlatives is also adds suspense to where he is. The repetition of "or" in "surpicore... Summov" the ending of "or" adds suspense to Jurg and ~~add~~ ~~to~~ they guess where he is. Jurgs to be and think about where he is. The short sentence at the start is abrupt and shocking leading the Jurg to think where he actually is. "maxime mediterraneus" - completely shut out from the sea - repetition of 'in' emphasises how good at a place it was to keep the pirate. repetition of "qui" and "quo" - where and why - allow the Jurg to think where the pirate is.
