

Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component.

Candidate 1

Question 1

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because there is a description the emotional need to feel secure, with a developed point regarding safety.

Question 2

The candidate was awarded **1 mark** because there is a description of 'nurture' as an environmental influence. No second mark was awarded due the basic description, and/or lack of development of the initial point.

Question 3

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because there is a description of the Behaviourist Approach key concept of 'blank slates'. The point is developed to describe behaviour based on interactions with others.

Question 4

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because there is an explanation of a child's past experience in relation to their inner thoughts. The candidate has given this reason to show a connection to helping the care worker's understanding.

Question 5

The candidate was awarded **0 marks** because they have not described the process of secondary socialisation.

Question 6

The candidate was awarded **4 marks** because there is a description of Norms and a developed point on acceptable and appropriate behaviour, 'no-one would be shocked'. There is a description of Values as an individual's beliefs and a developed point to recognise that these can vary.

Question 7

The candidate was awarded **4 marks** because there is an explanation of the negative impact on an individual's life chances in relation to: decreased chances in employment, decreased chances in housing/success in life, negative impact on wellbeing with a developed point to explain feelings of worthlessness.

Question 8(a)

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because there is an identification and basic description of the assessment stage of the care planning process.

Question 8(b)

The candidate was awarded **3 marks** because there is an identification and accurate description of the Monitoring stage, including: the plan being checked, and subsequently adapted should needs, wishes or decisions change.

Question 9

The candidate was awarded **4 marks** because there is an accurate description of the principle of 'Be included' with the service user fully involved and having a say in their plans. There is also an accurate description of the principle of 'Wellbeing' with the service users helped and supported to reach their full potential.

Question 10

The candidate was awarded **1 mark** because there is a brief description of ensuring that service users are treated with dignity and respect.

Question 11

The candidate was awarded **3 marks** because the explanation includes Calum's Social needs of: being involved in activities, actual or virtual family and friends visits, finding like-minded others with similar interests.

Question 12

The candidate was awarded **1 mark** because of the basic description as government funded care like the NHS.
