

# Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each question of this course assessment component.

## Candidate 4

### Question 34

The candidate was awarded **5 marks**.

Candidate initially sets out this answer very well but then gives some information that does not answer the question. One mark is given at line four 'Palliative care' and a second mark is given at the end of this section at 'understand.' In the next section Assisted dying marks were awarded for the first and third bullet point the candidate gives. They identify that someone may 'no longer wish to be alive', 'sound mind', 'take medication' and 'totally up to them'. Three marks given for this section.

### Question 35

The candidate was awarded **4 marks**.

One mark was given at 'rights' on line four. Further mark given at 'unsound mind'. The next bullet point does not gain any marks. The final paragraph has a double tick at the end. The candidate gives an answer 'do with your body as you want' as well as an example of 'aborting a baby'.

### Question 36

The candidate was awarded **2 marks**.

Marks in this question are awarded for explaining moral issues. The candidate gave an acceptable point on the sanctity of life and animals and a double tick was given at 'Humans'.

### Question 37

The candidate was awarded **2 marks**.

1 mark was given at end of first bullet point. A second mark given on the second bottom line 'become'. No marks were awarded for the last section.

### Question 38

The candidate was awarded **8 marks**.

The first paragraph sets up the answers that are given later. This question is answered well by the candidate as they go beyond the eight marks on offer in this question. On the first page marks were given at 'inheritance', 'Hell' & 'Karma'. On the following page marks were awarded for 'kill someone', 'each other' (line 13) and 'their choice' on the second last bullet point. On the final page of this answer marks were given right at the top to acknowledge the last paragraph on the previous page. The following four paragraphs each warrant a mark.
