It is also a way for staff to know what care, service users should be receiving and can be changed and should be updated with growing/lessening needs.</p>
10.	<p>during the care planning process meetings should be held with service users, staff, doctors, social worker or anybody involved in the case. They meet to describe and agree what needs the individual will have and how to address those needs. Once this has been done all the workers will go back and undertake any tasks that their department is required</p>

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to address, once this has been done and put in place the plan should be reviewed after a period of time to make sure its working and everybody is happy that the need are being met.

11. Positive care environment - an environment for the service user that s/he feels happy in. They are able to be cared for in a way thats right for them. They have a right to be involved in their own care (where possible) so this makes them feel confident in the care that they are receiving.
