

Commentary on candidate evidence

The evidence for this candidate has achieved the following marks for each question of this question paper.

Candidate 1

Question 1

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have identified a physical activity and immunisation programme.

Question 2

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have described moving from studying to working and building new friendships.

Question 3

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they described being born as a blank slate and learned behaviour.

Question 4

The candidate was awarded **4/4 marks** because they have explained nature with a relevant influence and nurture with a relevant example.

Question 5

The candidate was awarded **3/3 marks** because they have provided an accurate description of primary socialisation, secondary socialisation, and influences.

Question 6

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they described mass media and the influences of mass media.

The candidate did not identify where question 6 starts. However, it was obvious question 6 was being answered and therefore was marked.

Question 7

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have described a value as something they believe in and provided a good example.

The candidate labelled their response as 'B'. However, this clearly answers question 7 and therefore was marked.

Question 8(a)

The candidate was awarded **1/1 mark** because they provided a clear description of prejudice.

Question 8(b)

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have explained how being denied employment opportunities will affect their life chances and the opportunity to better themselves.

Question 9

The candidate was awarded **3/3 marks** because they have clearly explained the purpose of a care plan is to set goals, provide consistency and meet needs.

Question 10

The candidate was awarded **4/4 marks** because they described two stages of the care planning process: the assessment stage and the implementation stage.

Question 11

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they provided a detailed description of the physical environment.

Question 12(a)

The candidate was awarded **3/3 marks** because the explanation was based around Elizabeth's needs, and that she knows what her needs are and should be heard, and that she still wants her independence.

Question 12(b)

The candidate was awarded **0/2 marks** because they did not describe positive care according to the marking guidelines.

Question 13

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they explained that covering Elizabeth up after bathing, and always putting service users' needs and wishes first ensures she is treated with dignity and respect.

Question 14

The candidate was awarded **2/4 marks** because they identified that the Support Worker can take Elizabeth out on day trips, this is not denying her access to resources, which links to the home.

Candidate 2

Question 1

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they identified that food is required for adequate nutrition and shelter to maintain body temperature.

Question 2

The candidate was awarded **0/2 marks** because their response does not meet the requirements of the marking instructions.

Question 3

The candidate was awarded **1/2 marks** because they described rewarding behaviour.

Question 4

The candidate was awarded **4/4 marks** because they explained that nature is inherited and genetic, and nurture (unpredictable family life) may be teaching him to be wary or anxious.

Question 5

The candidate was awarded **3/3 marks** because they have given an accurate description of primary socialisation, secondary socialisation and influences.

Question 6

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have described mass media and the influences of mass media — a way to see other views.

Question 7

The candidate was awarded **1/2 marks** because they described a value as something they hold dear.

Question 8(a)

The candidate was awarded **1/1 mark** because they have clearly described prejudice.

Question 8(b)

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** because they have explained how being denied employment opportunities will affect their life chances.

Question 9

The candidate was awarded **3/3 marks** because they have explained the purpose of a care plan is to ensure the care provided suits the individual, consistency of care and responsive to growing or lessening needs.

Question 10

The candidate was awarded **2/4 marks** because, although the candidate has not named the stages, there is a description of the assessment stage and the evaluation stage of the planning process.

Question 11

The candidate was awarded **0/2 marks** because their response does not meet the requirements of the marking instructions.

Question 12(a)

The candidate was awarded **1/3 marks** because the explanation provided was brief.

Question 12(b)

The candidate was awarded **0/2 marks** because they did not describe positive care according to the marking guidelines.

The candidate was awarded **2/2 marks** for explaining that Elizabeth's needs and wishes need to be taken into account and staff are always being nice and polite ensures she is treated with dignity and respect.
