## Commentary on candidate 1 evidence

## Ageing China: is the Chinese government right to abolish the one-child policy?

## A - Justify the choice of a current complex geographical issue to critically evaluate (4 marks)

The candidate was awarded 4 marks as follows:
$>$ the choice of issue is relevant and current
> evidence of available contrasting viewpoints/ explicit purpose for critically evaluating the issue
$>$ there is explicit reference to relevant geographical information
$>$ there is contextualisation

## B - Undertake wider background reading from a wide range of sources relating to the geographical issue ( 8 marks)

The candidate was awarded 4 marks as follows:
$>2$ sources of sufficient quality have been used although the relevance of the third source (2011) is questionable...why is this prioritised? (page 8)
$>$ different viewpoints are identified
$>$ is there explicit evidence of wider background reading?

## C - Summarise a wide range of viewpoints (10 marks)

The candidate was awarded 4 marks as follows:
$>$ there is a range of key viewpoints (but this is just implicit in source) with a reasonable degree of understanding.
$>$ The information is organised but summarised rather formulaically

## D- Critically evaluate each of the viewpoints (10 marks)

The candidate was awarded 5 marks as follows:
$>$ the credibility of authors/organisations (page 6) is well documented
$>$ there is recognition of bias/use of uncited statistics

## E - Reach reasoned conclusion(s) (8 marks)

The candidate was awarded 4 marks as follows:
$>$ relevant pieces of information are linked together and critically assessed, with relevant use of the information.
$>$ An overall judgement has been included

## Commentary on candidate 2 evidence

## Is the EU quota system at present able to maintain sustainable fish stocks \& the British fishing industry?

## A - Justify the choice of a current complex geographical issue to critically evaluate (4 marks)

The candidate was awarded 3 marks as follows:
$>$ the issue is relevant and current ('while the population of Britain increases, the marine environment .fished to commercial extinction')
$>$ there is evidence of available contrasting viewpoints/ explicit purpose for critically evaluating the issue (relevant information on pages 1 and 2)
$>$ there is explicit reference to relevant geographical information (Figure 1)
> there is some implicit contextualisation

## B - Undertake wider background reading from a wide range of sources relating to the geographical issue ( 8 marks)

The candidate was awarded 6 marks as follows:
> there are 2 sources of sufficient quality. However, the third source/viewpoint is unclear (page 4 )...why is this prioritised?
$>$ different viewpoints are identified
$>$ there is some explicit evidence of wider background reading to support prioritised source material/viewpoints (page 4 - 'The Independent'.....but note that this is poorly cited)

## C - Summarise a wide range of viewpoints (10 marks)

The candidate was awarded 8 marks as follows:
$>$ there is a range of key viewpoints with a good degree of understanding/cross-referencing (page 2)
$>$ the information is organised
$>$ the maps/diagrams enhance the information (page 4)

## D- Critically evaluate each of the viewpoints (10 marks)

The candidate was awarded 4 marks because on page 5 - in the middle paragraph - there is limited recognition of bias/use of statistics

## E - Reach reasoned conclusion(s) (8 marks)

The candidate was awarded 6 marks as follows:
$>$ relevant pieces of information are linked together and critically assessed, with relevant use of the information.
$>$ An overall judgement/statement is included in the last sentence
